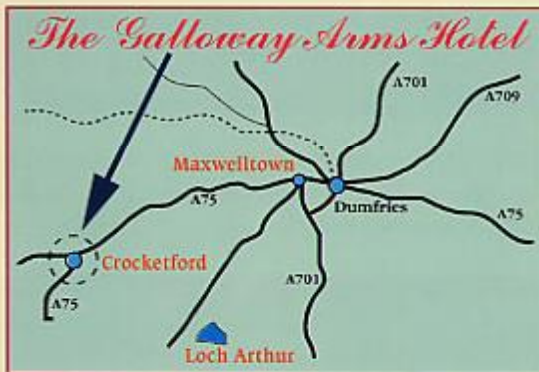

From the magnificent Galloway Highlands culminating in Glen Trool and The Merrick (2762 ft.), Southern Scotland's highest peak, to the beauty of the Solway Coast with its many delightful inlets, harbours and sandy beaches, Galloway is a land of rich contrasts with a wide range of activities to attract the visitor. No less than 12 fine golf courses lie within a 15 to 30 minute drive of **The Galloway Arms**, with 30 courses in the region as a whole. Nearby there is plentiful loch, river and sea-fishing. There are many species of birds inhabiting coast and moorlands, and both coastal and hill walking are very popular sports, with the now famous **Southern Upland Way** running from Portpatrick in the south-west to Cockburnspath in Berwickshire.

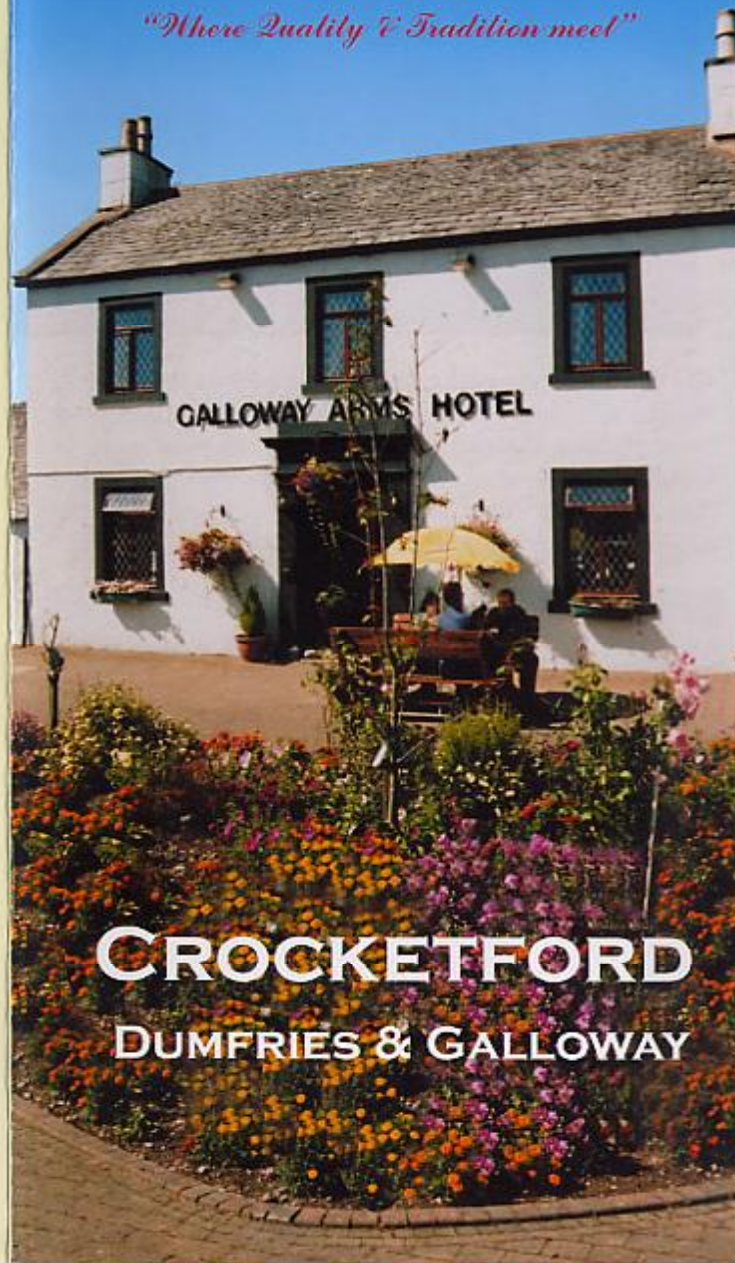

The Galloway Arms is a traditional hostelry lying midway between the County Town of Dumfries and the busy Market Town of Castle Douglas. These towns are 18 miles apart, so that the Hotel has over the years become fondly referred to as 'The Nine Mile Bar', a title now happily conferred on the newly refurbished and extended Lounge Bar.



Daily bar lunches and suppers are also served in The Nine Mile Bar, which has gained an excellent reputation for catering to small parties and functions. For larger weddings and functions with up to 100 guests, The Galloway Function Suite is very popular.
